Here's the explanation from Caroline Pollock. The figure is not 16 – it's 6 – please see below.

Hi Sarah.

The number of EX or EW species in 2008 was 869 and the figure for this year is 875 - that's a difference of 6, not 16. The explanation of the six species is as I sent last week (copied below).

Caroline.

2008 Red List (EX & EW species) = 869
2009 Red List (EX & EW species) = 875
```

This year, 11 species entered the EX and EW categories (which would bring last year's figure up to 880 species); but 4 species moved out of those categories (which brings the revised figure back down to 876 species); and 1 species was removed as it is no longer recognised as a valid species (which results in the final figure of 875 species).

Species moving into EX or EW:

- Kihansi Spray Toad in the press release (previously CR, now EW).
- 10 species of Polynesian Tree Snails (Partula labrusca (EX), Partula rosea (EW), Partula varia (EW), Pachnodus curiosus (EX), Pachnodus ladiguensis (EX), Partula lugubris (EX), Partula navigatoria (EX), Partula ovalis (EX), Rhachistia aldabrae (EX), Samoana inflata (EX)

Species moving out of EX or EW:

- Miles' Robber Frog (Craugastor milesi) previously thought to be Extinct, rediscovered in 2008. Now CR
- Partula affinis a Polynesian tree snail previously thought to be Extinct, but then rediscovered (I think! The species account doesn't actually say.). Now CR.
- Partula taeniata a Polynesian Tree Snail, previously thought to be Extinct, but then rediscovered in 2003.
- Anonidium usambarense a plant that was previously considered Extinct, but now is assessed as DD because it is not clear that it is actually that species at all

Species removed from the Red List because of taxonomic reasons:

- Red-throated Wood Rail (Aramides gutturalis) - this bird is no longer recognised as a valid species.
